Thank you for your enquiry regarding the transport of expended/empty shell casings in the postal system.

I've looked over the dangerous and prohibited goods guidelines and there is no mention of these items being restricted. Only ammunition containing chemical compounds is restricted in the post, therefore sending these empty casings in the post should pose no problem. The only concern you may have to face is residue left in the expended casings being picked up and packages confiscated by the police.

I hope that this information has helped and that you enjoy the rest of your day. If there is anything else that we can do for you, please do not hesitate to contact us again.

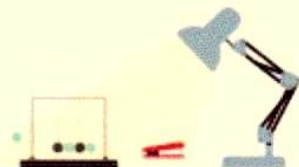
